Department of Treasury OSDBU 50 States Initiative Alliance

Formed a strategic alliance with the Department of Treasury's Office of Small and Disadvantaged Business Utilization, enhancing advocacy efforts and providing members with vital resources nationwide.









National Roanoke Community Beautification Day

Recognized by Governor Glenn Youngkin and Roanoke Mayor-elect Sherman Lea Sr., this initiative brought together members and community leaders to enhance local public spaces and residential properties in underserved and fostering community pride and engagement. Small businesses partner for networking and business opportunities.















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4 Legislative Milestone

Driving Diversity and Economic Empowerment

We are thrilled to announce that one of our top legislative priorities, HB 1361, has been signed by Governor Glenn Youngkin. This bill aims to provide a competitive advantage for Virginia businesses when competing for government contracts against out-of-state vendors. The legislation was further enhanced by the addition of HB 164, a provision envisioned by our esteemed Leadership Board Member, James Lewis, back in April 2023. This new provision will empower local governments to establish a contracting preference for local businesses. Less than a year later, thanks to the leadership of the Virginia Diverse Chamber of Commerce, this vision has become a law.



8-Week Training Programs

Successfully launched two comprehensive training programs, engaging 64 participants. Of these, 42 graduates completed business plans, positioning them for success in the competitive marketplace.



Facilitated streamlined access to Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFI) financing for graduates, enabling them to secure funding for their business ventures.

6 National Virtual Biz Pitch Competitions

Biz Pitch Competitions

Conducted two virtual business pitch competitions featuring 20 participants, culminating in 6 winners who each received grants totaling \$10,000. This initiative provided critical funding and exposure for emerging entrepreneurs, fostering innovation and creativity in our business community.

The official free newsletter of the Virginia Diverse Chamber of Commerce, now with 15,000 subscribers, published 12 editions in 2024. Policy Initiatives



Engaged with local and state lawmakers to advocate for policies supporting small businesses and equitable access to resources to include City of Virginia Beach Mayor Robert Bobby Dyer, 79th District Delegate Rae Cousins, and Interium Roanoke City Manager Dr. Lydia Patton.

Partnerships

Established partnerships with organizations like the US Department of Treasury OSDBU, Virginia Beach Procurement and Finance Department and Virginia Beach Sheriff Office, City of Roanoke Police Department and RISE Collaborative Center enhancing access to funding and resources for our members.

Members reported an average revenue growth of 25% in 2024, attributed to the resources and connections made through the Chamber.

Job Creation

Members collectively created over 100 new jobs, contributing significantly to local economies.

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Launched a member-exclusive online portal providing resources, networking opportunities, and a marketplace for members to showcase their products and services.

Innovation Grants

Aim to reach 1,500 members by the end of 2025, focusing on strategic outreach and enhanced member benefits.


Expanding Services

Continue to amplify our voice at the state and national levels, ensuring the needs of diverse businesses are represented.


